ABOUT THE REGION

Brisbane is the capital city of Queensland, with a metropolitan population of 2.3 million, making it the third-largest city in Australia.

The city is situated along the Brisbane River, and its eastern suburbs line the shores of Moreton Bay. The greater Brisbane region is on the coastal plain east of the Great Dividing Range. Brisbane's metropolitan area sprawls from Caboolture in the north to Beenleigh in the south, and across to Ipswich in the south west.

There is a well-served public transport system in Brisbane which is known as Translink. There are three main types of public transport; train, bus and river ferry (boat).
